The Keystone State Volkssport Assn is sponsoring this special challenge once again to encourage participation in

Pennsylvania member club AVA sanctioned events.

Out of state walkers only have to walk 10 events in PA to obtain the award. Walkers that live in PA have to walk 20 events in PA to obtain the award.

You can download the record book from the KSVA website: www.ksva.net or the AVA website: www.ava.org. Then go to Clubs, pick PA, then Keystone State Volkssport Assn. That will take you to the choice of the 20/10 Challenge.

There is no fee to participate, but there is a fee to obtain the award. Once you complete the book, you can pay \$4 or \$5 to receive the award. If your award needs to be mailed, it will cost you the higher amount. Hand in your record book at a York White Rose Wanderer traditional event or a KSVA event, it will only cost you \$4.

# LBW - NORTH CAROLINA TRIANGLE BUS TRIP APRIL 26 THRU APRIL 29, 2014

Saturday, April 26: We'll leave the V.E. at 7:00 A.M and travel to Richmond, VA for the Capital walk (6 and 10K available). We'll then proceed to Raleigh, NC. Our lodging for three nights will be the Hampton Inn Capital Boulevard North at 3621 Spring Forest Road (phone 919-872-7111).

Sunday, April 27: We travel to Hillsborough, an historic small town with architecture that spans three centuries. Our 5 or 10k walk is mostly flat with minor hills along paved trails, sidewalks, quiet streets and natural surfaces. In the afternoon we'll visit an interesting attraction in the area (more info later).

Monday, April 28: This morning it's your choice of two walks in downtown Raleigh (5 and 10K available). The North Carolina State Capitol and Museums of History and Natural Sciences (all free) are nearby so try to visit at least one of them. That afternoon we'll visit the beautiful J.C. Raulston Arboretum.

Tuesday, April 29: After hotel checkout, we'll travel to nearby Durham (home of Duke University) for your choice of two walks in that city (5 and 10k available). Then we take the long ride back to the V.E., where we should arrive by about 8:00 P.M.

These prices include round trip transportation via Hagey deluxe motor coach, bus driver tip, snacks en route, lodging for three nights, three breakfasts, and four walks.

## LACKAWAXEN BORDER CROSSING BUS TRIP MAY 31.2014

Our second bus trip of the year will be a day trip to Lackawaxen, PA on May 31 to walk from the Zane Gray Museum across the Roebling Aqueduct into New York State. There are two 5K loops: first will cross the Roebling Aqueduct (Roebling Bridge-the oldest existing suspension bridge in the US)) into New York; the second is a simple out and back along the Lackawaxen River. All along the route are beautiful views of the Delaware River. The Start Point will be the Zane Grey

Museum which was the former home of the famous author. As an added feature, arrangements have been made for the walkers to enjoy a buffet dinner (\$13.75) at the historic Lackawaxen Inn.

LBW are partnering with the Volkssport Club at West Point to do the walk. Get all your deposits in ASAP to ensure you get a seat on the buses. The cost is \$60 for 2 events and lunch.

#### War of 1812

Less than 30 years after the Treaty of Paris ended the Revolutionary War and the United States officially gained recognition as a sovereign country, a young American nation again declared war on Great Britain.

The War of 1812 was fought for a variety of reasons, including British interference with American shipping, the seizure of American sailors, trade restrictions with France (with whom Britain was also at war), and British support of Native Americans which limited westward expansion.

We invite you to experience the 9 walks in the War of 1812 Series as we commemorate the Bicentennial of the War of 1812 and celebrate 200 years of peace between the US and Canada. The war was not over in one year so the program is still ongoing.

The War of 1812 Walk Series includes: Pennsylvania - Erie and New York - Buffalo, Williamsville, Lewiston, Youngstown, Pultneyville, Oswego, Sackets Harbor, and Ogdensburg. Each event has a different hat pin as an award. The one shown above is for Erie. The events will close in November 2013.

The Erie event starts at the Avalon Hotel, 16 W. 10th St, Erie PA. Ask for the Walk Box. The 10/6K Trail is rated 1A. The AVA Special Programs include: Baseball Walks, Fraternal Organization, Rainbow Color –Named Places, and Murals. There is also a Fort of the US to help you finish that program.
