The Keystone State Volkssport Assn is sponsoring this special challenge once again to encourage participation in Pennsylvania member club AVA sanctioned events.

Out of state walkers only have to walk 10 events in PA to obtain the award. Walkers that live in PA have to walk 20 events in PA to obtain the award.

You can download the record book from the KSVa website: [www.ksva.net](http://www.ksva.net) or the AVA website: [www.ava.org](http://www.ava.org). Then go to Clubs, pick PA, then Keystone State Volkssport Assn. That will take you to the choice of the 20/10 Challenge.

There is no fee to participate, but there is a fee to obtain the award. Once you complete the book, you can pay \$4 or \$5 to receive the award. If your award needs to be mailed, it will cost you the higher amount. Hand in your record book at a York White Rose Wanderer traditional event or a KSVa event, it will only cost you \$4.

17731, Eagles Mere Information Center/Jolly Trolley  
Side Car Shopping Area. There is some parking beside  
the shopping/food area, along street or across street.  
You will drive a short distance to the High Knob Scenic  
View Drive at Loyalsock State Forest to begin walk.

**Start Time:** 9:00AM to 1PM on both Saturday and  
Sunday.

**Finish Time:** All walkers must finish by 4:00PM.

**Fee:** IVV credit is \$3.00. There is no special award or  
preregistration for this event. Participation without AVA/  
IVV credit is FREE. IVV award books and New Walker  
packets will be available for \$5.00 each. Children 12  
and under walk for free.

**Trail:** 5K and 10K. The trail is rated as a 1A. The trail  
is on State Forest paved roads. The trail would not be  
suitable for strollers or wheelchairs because of getting to  
the side of the road. All participants must always be  
mindful of traffic.

Loyalsock State Forest is named for the Loyalsock  
Creek, a scenic freestone stream that winds through the  
heart of its 114,494 acres. It is located mainly in  
Sullivan, Lycoming and Bradford counties. The forest  
spans the northern tier's "endless Mountains" and  
features flaming fall foliage and cascading waterfalls.

At the registration area there are a few places to eat and  
purchase souvenirs to support the area. In addition  
Worlds End State Park is close by. To the East is the  
walk in Tunkhannock, Wyoming County and to the North  
State Parks are located in Bradford and Tioga Counties.  
Come enjoy the scenery and get more counties and  
State Parks.

**Directions:** From Harrisburg take your favorite route to I  
-80 then take PA 405 exit toward Muncy/Hughesville.  
Turn right onto State Rt. 405/PA-405. PA-405 after about  
4 m. becomes US-220 N. Continue until you turn left  
onto PA-42 and go .6 mile to Eagles Mere Registration  
area.

From Philadelphia take I-80 N to PA-42. Take right onto  
Rt. 220/US-220 N/PA-42 1.1 mi. Turn left onto PA-42  
for .6mi to Registration area.

Don't forget to bring your pet supplies to this event too.



## New Special Programs for 2016

### Bridges-Spanning the USA

Acknowledging our dependence on bridges, where the route goes over or under a bridge (can be across any waterway, ravine, marsh, road or railroad to afford passage of motor vehicles, pedestrians and/or rail cars).

### Lady Liberty

Event passing by or with the ability to view from the trail the Statue of Liberty or a replica (murals are acceptable)

### Make a Wish - Water Fountains

Decorative water fountains or splash pad, natural or manmade and fountain does not need to be operating.

### National Parks Centennial

All National Parks qualify as well as events that pass by a national monument or national memorial.

### State Street Sashay

Any event on a street named "State Street"

### Take a Walk in a City Park

Walk by or through a named city park

### Treasure Hunt

Places named with illusion to precious metals such as ice, rock, stone, or names of gems or minerals. Street names don't qualify.

### Vice Presidential Walks

Honoring the Vice Presidents - Birth places, burial sites, towns of residence as well as schools, roads, towns or other geographical places named for the VPs.

### United States Post Offices

Pass a US Post Office building.

### Walking America's Ports of Call

Any walk in a city named for a Port or locations that are currently or have been historically a Port

### Walking the Path of Inventors

Walking by well known inventors/researchers homes, gravesites, labs, workplaces or museums.

### Walk the USA-Street by Street

Walk a street in all 50 states

### Tunkhannock Seasonal Walk - Wyoming County

Correction: The exit number is 170B off of I-81 (Route 309 North)

**Mt Pisgah State Park** - The new start point is Dandy Mini Mart, 590 Elmira St, Troy PA 16947. 570-297-2030

It is located on US -6 (Elmira St) between Mansfield and Towanda. The Dandy Mini Mart is on the east side of Troy, across from the Tops Market. Look for the Gulf Gas Sign. The start box is on a rack at the rear of the store next to the restrooms.

**Promised Land & Varden** walks - Promised Land is now rated 2C, very rocky. Recommend only sturdy walkers with walking sticks & boots. Varden trail 17 at Mid valley tract is very swampy.

**Moraine and Jennings** - For the easiest 5K walk at these parks - Moraine would be loop 2; Jennings would be loop 1

## Volksbiking

For volkssporters who bicycle: If you want emails sent to you about upcoming volksbikes, send your email address to Tom and he will add them to his email list for future events.

### 1. New Year Round Bike Events:

#### **Pennsylvania:**

**Ansonia** – Tioga State Forest: This bike event is on the Pine Creek Rail Trail which many consider to be the premier rail-trail in Pennsylvania. The entire Pine Creek Rail Trail is sanctioned so you may start anywhere you wish and go as far as you want. The start box is at the Darling Run Trail Head (approximately Mile 8) near the north end of the trail. The Pine Creek Rail Trail has a fine gravel surface.

**Valley Forge** – Schuylkill River Trail: The Liberty Bell Wanderers have sanctioned 33K between Valley Forge and the Philadelphia Art Museum. Their goal is to sanction the entire Schuylkill River Trail as the trail is completed. The start box is at the Information Desk at the Valley Forge Visitors Center. The trail is paved.

#### **Virginia:**

**Dumfries** (Montclair) – The Wood & Dale Wanderers had this route as a traditional bike event last November and sanctioned it for 2015 as a YRE. The ride is on a paved bike path.

### 2. Bike Events Temporarily Closed:

#### **Maryland:**

**College Park** – The bike event is closed due to the collapse of a wooden bridge onto the trail.

**Stevensville** – The trail is closed past the Visitors Center due to construction on the draw bridge. You can still do a short distance.

3. “Guided Bike” Events: I am going to assume that you read the articles in the TAW or Checkpoint that describe what a “Guided Bike” event is. If not, say something and I will forward you the information.

a. A “Guided Bike” event was held April 19 on the Cumberland Valley Rail Trail from Shippensburg, PA. This was held in conjunction with a fundraiser for the trail sponsored by the Cumberland Valley Rails-to-Trails. We had 7 participants.

b. The trailing email describes a proposed “Guided Bike” event on the W&OD Trail from Sterling in Northern Virginia. The event was sanctioned for Saturday, July 18 (not July 11 as mentioned in the email). The W&OD Trail has a paved surface. For those looking for something extra, there are two YRE walks in the Sterling area.

c. There will be another “Guided Bike” event on the W&OD Trail on Saturday, August 8. This event will start from the Douglas Community Center in Leesburg, VA and go east. Afterwards, we will have lunch at the Leesburg Brewing Company which is .2 mile off of the trail. There are three YRE volksmarches in Leesburg.

d. A “Guided Bike” event has been sanctioned for Thursday, September 24 on the Virginia Creeper Trail from Damascus, VA. This date is to accommodate the Asheville Amblers but is open to everyone. Damascus is in the southwest corner of Virginia. The Asheville Amblers will rent mountain bikes and take a shuttle to Whitetop. The Virginia Creeper Trail has a packed earth surface and can be done on a hybrid bike if you are careful. From there, it is a 17 mile downhill ride back to Damascus. There are also three volksmarches in the area: Whitetop, Galax, and Marion – Hungry Mother State Park. I know this would be an overnight trip for everyone. To make it

worthwhile to travel that distance, I have several options if you want something different than the three walks and want to stay additional days. Let me know your thoughts.

(1). I can also sanction the Virginia Creeper Trail between Damascus and Abington. It would be downhill starting from Abington.

(2) I can sanction a “Guided Bike” Event on the New River Trail in VA.

(3) I can sanction a “Guided Bike” Event on the Greenbrier Trail in WV.

e. A “Guided Bike” event has been scheduled for Saturday, October 31 in Rockville, MD on the Rock Creek Park Trail. This is in conjunction with the Seneca Valley Sugarloafers’ s Rockville-Croydon Park walk.

f. I am planning on a “Guided Bike” event in Burke, VA. This would be on paved bike paths.

g. I am also planning on a “Guided Bike” event on the canals along the Delaware River north of Morrisville/Trenton. This would be a loop using the Delaware Canal (Pennsylvania), D&R Canal (New Jersey), and two of the bridges across the Delaware River.

4. AVA Convention: In addition to the walks, there will be a bike event available Monday – Friday starting from the hotel. On Tuesday, June 16, there will be a group bike ride with the local bike club. There will also be a swim event available from Monday-Friday also using the hotel’s swimming pool. I have heard that there is a seasonal swim event at/near where the Vancouver walk is on Tuesday, June 16. There is a bike shop in Salem that rents bikes. Make sure you bring your own helmet or confirm that the bike shop will provide one.

We have so many wonderful parks and forests and this will be the year to get out and enjoy them. But be sure to wear bug spray in the summer. Many of these walks can be snow shod. So that would be a new adventure. There is even a swim.

Pick up a KSVA Year Round and Seasonal Booklet and the tear off the covers. These are your booklets for this challenge and the 20/10 Challenge. This program is also run the same as the 20/10 Challenge.

On the left is the award patch for walking Little Buffalo State Park. On the right is the Completion Patch for walking 10 state parks in the State Parks and Forests Challenge Program.

Little Buffalo State Park is in Perry County. You register at Sharar's Grocery, 19 S 2nd St, Newport (great deli sandwiches). The walk box is on the bottom shelf in front of you as you enter the store. Hours are Monday-Saturday 8 am to 10 pm. Sunday 9 to 9. Closed Christmas. The park opens at 8 and closes at dusk. The award and credit is \$7.00. Credit only is \$3 and of course you can walk for free. You will sign in and pick up your directions for the walk and then drive to the park. The park is 3 miles away.

The trail is rated 1A as most of it is on paved roads. Some is through the woods, grassy areas by Shoaff's Mill, Clay's Covered Bridge and by the lake. The trail misses the great views, but the tranquility can still be enjoyed. Little Buffalo is only about 36 miles from Harrisburg. Get started on the PA State Park and Forest Challenge and enjoy Little Buffalo.

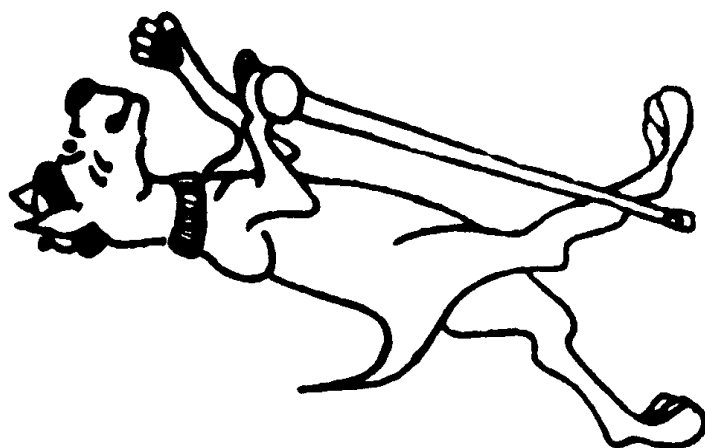
