President's Message



Greetings Fellow Rovers,

There is much to cover in this letter. Effective January 1, the AVA is increasing the amount the clubs may charge per walker to a maximum of \$4, of which \$2 is sent to AVA, with the various clubs retaining the remainder. This increase is automatic for events on the online start box for both of us who

use it. The free walker designation is now gone, they are now called guests. The AVA will still get the \$2 for these participants, it is up to each individual club whether they will charge the guests or pay out of their coffers. At the November meeting, it was decided that the Susquehanna Rovers would increase walk fees to \$4, with youth and guests still walking for free, as we get enough from donations to cover them. The club also sends 10 cents for each walker to our state organization.

I can hear it now. That's a big increase. How long has it been since the walk fee was raised last? 20 years? Everything else went up in the meantime too. The AVA needed to increase fees. It is what it is. The AVA only gets 25 cents additional per participant, while the club gets 75 cents more. Also, they came up a little short on the Big Give this year. Pavilion rent increased too, and it was hard to make a traditional event work with what funds it would have brought in.

Speaking of meetings, the November meeting was held on the KSVA meetup site and appeared to work well, but I'm still getting the hang of setting up the meetings. The meeting software sends the email invitations and I probably missed more than a few. Sorry about that, I'm still learning.

I was told we had a good turnout for the Hummelstown group walk. In typical fashion, I caught whatever bug is going around and had to go into hiding so I wouldn't share it with everyone like I did with my mom. So I missed the group walk. If anyone has any ideas for walks let me know.




Everyone got back safely and had a full tummy when they left. I hope Charlie smiled at our efforts.


