#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

**VOLKSSPORTING** is an adventure in health, recreation, fellowship and fun. Volkssporting literally translates as "sport of the people". The program consists of organized events designed to appeal to people of all ages. These are noncompetitive events. This is exercise at your own pace.

The volkssporting philosophy recognizes that everyone who participates is a winner and eligible for an award as described in the event brochures.

Most events are walks, but sports such as bicycling, swimming and cross-country skiing are also included. Each event has a pre-marked trail on which to enjoy the company of friends, family and fellow volkssporters.

**IVV/AVA Sanction:** All events are sanctioned by the American Volkssport Association (AVA), a member of the International Federation of Popular Sports (IVV) and are open to the general public. Events count toward acquisition of IVV Event and Distance Awards.

**Registration and Fees:** Almost all events are free. However, those paying the appropriate registration fees and completing the course will receive IVV credit(s) and/or an award, if one is offered for the event. "A" award participants may purchase additional "B" awards. An "A" award is one that is especially made for a specific event. "B" awards are from former events.

**IVV Record Books:** IVV issues awards for participants who complete a milestone number of events (10, 30, 50, etc.) and/or travel total distances of 500, 1000, 1500 km, etc. Credit for these achievements is recorded by stamping event and distance books after completing an event for which the appropriate fees have been paid.

Registration for the IVV/AVA stamp is \$3.00 for each event and gives the participant credit in both books. The stamp for each Year Round Event or Seasonal Event is allowed each day that the event is walked and in the distance books as many times as the event is completed. Trails may be completed twice on the same day for distance credit at no additional charge, with the exception of bike events.

Awards for completing the IVV achievement books consist of a lapel pin, patch and certificate acknowledging completion of each level of accomplishment.

Event and distance books are \$6.00 each. Some clubs have them for sale in their start box. Other clubs include insert cards for your use. A New Walker Packet is available for \$5.00 that includes an event book, a distance book and three coupons that are good for IVV credit.

**Procedures:** At each event start, each participant must register to obtain a start card which must be filled out. This card must be carried, marked at checkpoints and returned at the completion of the trail. All participants must sign the Waiver of Liability.

Consult the event publication for a description of the trail, rating, dates, and times. Participate in the event during daylight hours only. A club may have more than one route available at a location each with a separate sanction number. If you are traveling a long distance, you may wish to call or email to confirm the information.

Please remember the registration point is a business and customers come first. No pets should be taken inside.



#### **HISTORY**

The Altoona area was originally inhabited by native Americans of the Iroquois Confederacy. The first western settlers arrived in the mid 1700's. A series of stockades were constructed in the region as a defense against Indian raids including Fort Roberdeau.

In 1811, iron making began at the Allegheny Furnace. The owner of the furnace built the Baker Mansion nearby. By 1831, the Main Line of the PA Canal was extended west to nearby Hollidaysburg. The Canal connected to the Allegheny Portage Railroad in 1834, which hoisted boats over the Allegheny Ridge on primitive rail cars.

The PA Railroad was chartered bay by Pennsylvania in 1846. In 1849, the Railroad began developing the community that became Altoona - as a staging area for the construction of the rail line. By 1850, the railroad had been constructed from Harrisburg west to Altoona. The Allegheny Ridge was a major barrier to the completion of an east-west railroad across Pennsylvania. Through innovative engineering, the Horseshoe Curve was completed in 1854 west of Altoona to provide a westward passage at a grade that was gradual enough for heavy trains. It is now designated a National Historic Landmark. By 1880, Altoona's population had reached almost 20,000.

The original rail yard was centered in the vicinity of the present-day Station Mall. (the start point is in this mall) Other industries included silk, meat-packing and clothing.

Penn State Altoona opened its own doors in 1939 to 119 freshmen and nine faculty members in downtown Altoona. On July 1, 1997 the Penn State Altoona Campus became Penn State Altoona, a four-year baccalaureate degree-granting college of the University.

**TRAIL:** This is an easy walk through downtown Altoona and Penn State Altoona campus. Part of the walk is on a bike route. There are some hills.

**GENERAL INFORMATION:** The trail is suitable for strollers and wheelchair users, but there may be some difficulty. Pets are allowed on leashes. Please clean up after them. Food, water and restrooms are available at the start.

**FEES:** IVV Credit Only - \$3.00. You may walk for free. A trail may be completed twice on the same day at no additional charge.

**DIRECTIONS: From I-99/US Route 220:** Take Exit 33 (17th Street). Turn slight right onto 17th Street. Drive 1.6 miles and turn right onto 9th Avenue. McDonald's is on your left.

The walk also features a section of the Lehigh Canal on an island in the Lehigh River.



**Procedures:** When you arrive, ask for the walk box and follow enclosed instructions. Please be patient this is a business. No pre-registration, no refunds. Groups of 10+ may call Point of Contact for assistance.

**Fees:** Fees are \$3.00 for IVV Credit, or walk for <u>free</u>; please plan to pay all fees by check. All are welcome.

**Trail:** The walk takes you through Lehigh University, the South Bethlehem Greenway (rail-trail), and through the former Bethlehem Steel property. The redeveloped area includes a casino, hotel, outlet mall, PBS station, arts campus, skating rink, and of course the Steel ruins. A new addition to the walk is the 2,000 foot long trestle which recently opened as a public walkway on the former Bethlehem Steel campus. The trestle was once used as a narrow gauge railroad to carry coke, limestone and iron ore to the blast furnaces. The walk continues into Fountain Hill past the mansions of 19th century Bethlehem movers and shakers.

**Conditions:** Please walk only during daylight hours and not during severe weather conditions. Water and restrooms will be available at the Start and along the route. No littering. Pets must be leashed. Lack of curb cuts will make trail unsuitable for wheelchairs and of medium difficulty for strollers.

**Directions:** (See map) **From South:** Take Rt. 309 N to Rt. 378 N toward Bethlehem. Go about 6 miles and turn right on Broadway, then left on Brodhead Ave (Route 412). Enter parking lot from Brodhead Ave. Walkers are instructed to park in the back of the lot.

**From East:** Go I-78 W to exit 67 for PA-412/Hellertown/ Bethlehem. Turn right on PA-412. Follow highway signs for 4 miles. As you approach the Sands Casino, the road becomes Daly Ave, then 3rd St. Turn left on Brodhead Ave and enter the hotel parking lot. Walkers are instructed to park in the back of the lot.

From North or South via Turnpike: Take US-209 S and continue onto PA-33 S. Take the exit for US-22 W toward Bethlehem/Allentown. Exit onto PA-378 S toward Bethlehem. Travel 4 miles until freeway ends: merge to left lane. Slight left turn on 3rd St to bottom of hill. Turn right on Brodhead Ave and a quick left into hotel parking lot. Walkers are instructed to park in the back of the lot.

**From West:** Take US-22 E to PA-378 S toward Bethlehem. Continue with directions from above. Parking lot entrance is on Brodhead Ave. Walkers are instructed to park in the back of the lot.

It also qualifies for the KSVA County Program and KSVA State Parks and Forests Challenge.

**LOCATION:** Black Moshannon State Park covers 3,394 acres of forests and wetlands that provide recreational opportunities for thousands of visitors. The park conserves unique, natural environments and is in Centre County on PA 504, nine miles east of Philipsburg. More than 43,000 acres of the Moshannon State Forest surround the park and help create a remote and wild setting.

According to local tradition, American Indians called this watershed "Moss-Hanne," meaning "moose stream," thus the origin of the park's name. Appropriately, the "black" in the park name describes the tea-colored waters. The 250-acre Black Moshannon Lake is fed by clear springs and small streams which flow through the bogs that stretch in most directions from its shores. As the clear water flows through sphagnum moss and other wetland plants, it becomes colored by plant tannins. In a sense, the bog vegetation acts like a giant teabag to color the water.





**BURNHAM:** The Borough of Burnham is about 63 miles from Harrisburg and close to Lewistown. It is named for a town in England. It is home to the Standard Steel Company (formerly Freedom Forge) which has been making iron and steel products since 1795 and is likely the oldest continuously operating forging company in America. Standard Steel has served the railway industry since its inception. In 1904 the company produced the first solid forged and rolled wheel in the United States. The Kishacoquillas Creek (2nd Loop) is named for Chief Kishacoquillas a Shawnee Chief whose tribe occupied the area in the 1700s.

**TRAIL:** The trail is on paved roads through the Borough of Burnham and surrounding country side. The trail is two loops so you can use the restrooms at the YMCA in the middle of the trail. A portion of the trail goes through Derry Township Community Park with picnic and camping facilities, miniature golf, batting cages, several baseball fields, and the Theatre in the Park.

#### LEWISTOWN:

The borough was incorporated in 1795 and was named for William "Bill" Lewis, a Quaker and a member of the legislature, who was responsible for the designation of the borough as the county seat of Mifflin County. During the late 19th century Mifflin County became the crossroads of the Commonwealth. Located near the geographic center of the state, the area became a hub for traffic moving in every direction. Early roads crisscrossed the region, but it was the eventual construction of the Pennsylvania Canal and the



railroads that followed that truly positioned Mifflin County as an economic force in the state. But with the demise of the canal system, Mifflin County eventually lost its place as a major transportation hub. After Tropical Storm Agnes in 1972 businesses didn't rebuild in Lewistown. Lewistown is home to the Pennsylvania State Fire School, which is the only such facility in the state.

After registering at the YMCA in Burnham, you will drive 4.2 miles to Mifflin County Library in Lewistown to start the walk. There is ample parking. Please use the back of the lot. Driving directions will be on the trail instructions.

Some historians believe that the furnace was destroyed not just to slow the industrial power of the Union but also because of Stevens' views opposing slavery. The pastures surrounding the furnace were used as field hospitals during the Battle of Gettysburg later in July 1863. The furnace was rebuilt following the war, but was closed by 1902 when the land was sold to the state. Caledonia State Park was opened in 1903.[

Location: The name Camp Hill is believed to stem from a split in the congregation of Peace Church, which is located west of the current borough. One faction of the church began meeting outdoors in tents on a hill, therefore the name - Camp Hill. The Church of God now stands on that hill. Prior to the American Civil War, the area was locally known as White Hill (for Robert Whitehill) which served as a stop along the railroad between Harrisburg and Carlisle. During the Civil War, the Battle of Sporting Hill became the northernmost engagement of the Gettysburg campaign which took place in Camp Hill in late June 1863. Camp Hill was incorporated as a borough in 1885.

Originally named Bridgeport in 1883 and then Riverton in 1888, Lemoyne was finally named in honor of a French soldier, Charles LeMoyne who had once explored the Ohio River and later settled near Harrisburg. The town was incorporated in 1905. On the overlook of the Susquehanna River, is the earthworks of Fort Couch from the Civil War. Fort Washington was also there to protect Harrisburg, but homes and roads now cover the spot, but a marble marker at Fort Couch talks about both forts.

Walking Trail: The trail will go past the PA Bakery, Masonic Temple, the northern point of the Confederate invasion, passing Willow Park in Camp Hill and a Diner in Lemoyne to the heights of Lemoyne at Fort Couch and Fort Washington. The breastworks are still visible at Fort Couch and there is a lovely monument honoring the Civil War soldiers efforts. The trail is mostly hard surfaces with many hills, but only 1 significant hill..

Start Time: Dawn

Finish Time: Finish before dusk.

The name Carlisle was selected after its namesake, the county seat of Cumberland County in England. In the French and Indian War, Carlisle was the western point at which British Crown regiments bivouacked. As early as the colonial period, Carlisle was a major jumping-off point for travel west to the Ohio Valley and it continues to be a major crossroad. From 1870 to 1918, the U.S. Army operated the Indian Industrial School, which was the period's effort to educate the Native Americans. Today, the old school is home to the U.S. Army War College and trains senior Army officers from the U.S. and allied countries.

President James Buchanan graduated from Dickinson College. Jim Thorpe attended the Carlisle Indian School. There are two Historic Churches from the 1700"s - First Presbyterian and St. John's Episcopal Church.

The 6K trail includes some of the historic district and all of the special programs except for the US Post Office. The trail is mostly on sidewalks (with curb cuts) and paved paths. **Start/Finish Times**: The YWCA is open Monday – Friday 4:30 AM to 10:00 PM; Saturday – 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM; Sunday – 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM; During July, Aug, and Sept. call to verify Sunday hours. Closed on all Holidays. Please walk only during daylight hours. Tour Operators please contact the POC.

**Award and Fees:** The award is a 4" patch featuring the Mississippi Monument which is passed on the bike trail. The patch design was not completed at the printing of this booklet. The cost for IVV Credit and the award is \$7.00. The fee for IVV Credit is \$3.00 per event. There is no charge to participate without receiving IVV Credit. All are welcome.

The trails are mostly on paved park roads and city sidewalks. They are suitable for wheelchairs and strollers.

Walk 1 - This walk starts at the YWCA. The 5K trail passes the newest museum in Gettysburg, the Seminary Ridge Museum, and goes through areas of the battlefield on July 1, 1863 when the Union First Corps under John Reynolds/Abner Doubleday fought Confederates from A.P. Hill's Corps. It also passes the Peace Light. The 10K trail will also include a loop onto the Gettysburg College Campus and into downtown Gettysburg. The trail is mostly on paved park roads and city sidewalks.

Walk 2 – After registering, you must drive 2 miles from the start point to the start at the parking lot for the National Cemetery. There are two 5K trails. Either trail may be done for 5K credit. Both trails must be done for 10K credit. The 5K Town Trail goes through the Soldiers' National Cemetery and into downtown around the "square". The Battlefield Trail goes past the Highwater Mark area (where Pickett's Charge was stopped), past the PA Monument, and to the Visitors Center. There are no restrooms at the parking lot, however, the 5K Town Trail will pass restrooms in the National Cemetery within 1K of starting.

**Walk 3 –** After registering, you must drive 3 miles to the Longstreet Memorial/Amphitheater. There is a jiffy-john in the parking lot. The 5K Confederate Battle Line Trail (Day 2) is an out and back on the portion of the Confederate Battle Line for the troops who participated in Peach Orchard, Wheat Field, and Little Roundtop. The 5K Confederate Battle Line Trail (Day 3) is an out and back on the portion of the Confederate Battle Line for the troops who

participated in "Pickett's Charge". Both 5K trails must be done for 10K credit

The 15K Trail starts from the YWCA and goes on the Confederate line on Seminary Ridge, past the Peach Orchard and Wheat Field, on the Union Line on Cemetery Ridge, through the National Cemetery, site of Lincoln's Address, and the South and West areas of Gettysburg. The trails are on paved park roads, road shoulders, and city sidewalks. The trails are suitable for wheelchairs ad Strollers.

**Bike Trail:** This trail starts at the YWCA. You will be riding with vehicular traffic. Helmets must be worn. The 26K route is a figure 8 on paved roads around and through the Battlefield and Gettysburg. This route covers most of the major parts of the battlefield ad bicycling is an excellent way to tour the battlefield. The K route is only half of the figure 8 and is only thru parts of the battlefield for the first day of battle and the Spangler Spring/Culps Hill/East Cemetery Hill parts of the battlefield from the second day.

**Swim:** There is a link to the "Pool Schedule" at www.ywcagettysburg.org. Look for the "Lap Swim Schedule". Generally, it is Monday –Friday from 6 am to 9 pm; Sat from 8 am to 4:30 pm; Sunday from 10: am to 4:30 pm. Check the schedule as the pool closes occasionally for maintenance, swim meets, classes, swim team practice, etc. The swim will be 6 laps the length of the pool. The YWCA does not provide towels or locks for the wall lockers.



**LOCATION:** - visited by George Washington on his very first surveying expedition at the age of 17. - was cited by Thomas Jefferson, after a visit, as such a beautiful spot that it was worth a trip across the Atlantic. - was the starting place of the Lewis and Clarke expedition. - was the site of the first crossing of the Potomac by a railroad, on the first structural steel bridge in the world. - was the industrial town where using interchangeable parts in a manufacturing process was first invented and proven practical. - was the site of the John Brown raid which precipitated the Civil War. - was the first command of Stonewall Jackson, who raised and trained his famed Brigade here. - was the site of three Civil War battles, the major one involving over 30,000 troops on both sides which resulted in the largest surrender of US troops until Bataan in WWII. - was a bastion of elevating African Americans, with the first real academic college (Storer College) to educate freed slaves in all aspects of higher learning, rather than sewing and other trades.

LOCATION: Little Buffalo State Park's name is derived from the Little Buffalo Creek which flows through the area. 

**Location:** Manheim is located in South Central Pennsylvania in the heart of Pennsylvania Dutch Country. Founded in 1762, the town belongs to a select list of PA towns that antedate the Revolutionary War. The land was given to William Penn's faithful secretary, James Logan, by Penn's widow and sons. It was later purchased from Logan's granddaughter, Mary Morris, by Henry William Stiegel and his two business partners.

The plan of the town of Manheim provided for a wide open space in the center of town which is now known as Market Square. On this square, Stiegel erected an imposing mansion and office building and on another corner constructed a manufacturing plant where he ran a glassmaking operation. Far-sighted man that he was, he had schools built and hired a schoolmaster to educate the children of his workers. As an accomplished musician, he supported a band in Manheim and directed the choir of Trinity Lutheran Church in Lancaster. He was deeply concerned with affairs of the church so he gave the town Lutherans a plot of ground on which to build a church for 5 shillings and the rent of one red rose per year. That rent is still paid every year by Zion Lutheran Church to a descendant of Mr. Stiegel.

He tended to live above the means of his neighbors, and therefore they called him "Baron Von Stiegel". Although the glass from his factory was exceptional, during the troubled years preceding the Revolutionary War, his finances were reversed and he could not overcome those problems. He had complete financial failure, even necessitating a brief incarceration in debtor's prison.

However, the spirit of progress was surely not lacking in the minds of the leading citizens of Manheim, for in 1838, with a population of only 365, the town was incorporated as a borough.

**The Walk:** The walking trail starts in Manheim about 1 1/2 miles north of the Registration Point. (Driving instructions are in box.) It is on sidewalks and paved surfaces. You will be walking through school grounds, a covered bridge, past old churches and cemeteries, by a restored railroad station, the wide open Center Square area, and many lazy, quiet, serene streets.

One will revel in the uniqueness of this historic Lancaster County community.



#### HISTORY:

Maurice Goddard State Park is a 2,856-acre park located in Sandy Lake, PA. It features natural beauty, wildlife, waterways and public recreational facilities. Lake Wilhelm shares its shorelines with Maurice K. Goddard State Park. The dam, constructed in 1971, creates a 1,860-acre lake providing a resource for people and wildlife. Many species of fish and amphibians make Lake Wilhelm their home. A variety of outdoor activities are available in and around the Park vicinity.

Maurice K. Goddard State Park is named after Maurice K. Goddard. He was a graduate of the University of Maine and the University of California at Berkeley. After reaching the rank of Lieutenant Colonel during World War II, Goddard worked at Mont Alto Forestry School and later at Penn State Main Campus before he was appointed Secretary of the Pennsylvania Bureau of Forests and Waters, a forerunner of the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. Upon taking his position with the state, Goddard set about completing his goal of having a state park within 25 miles of every resident of Pennsylvania. When Goddard retired in 1979, after 24 years of working for the state parks, he had helped to add 45 state parks and over 130,000 acres of state park land to the Pennsylvania State Park system.

Moraine: Moraine State Park is located 3 miles east of Interstate 79 in Western Pennsylvania. Moraine State Park is named for the glacial moraines that cover its land. The moraines were formed at the conclusion of the last glacial period, a time when glaciers covered much of North America. A tongue of the glacier reached into Pennsylvania and, as the ice receded, left deposits of gravel, sand and clay. These created a landscape of gently rolling hills. The area was previously pitted with strip mines, gas and oil wells. It opened as a state park in 1970. Enclosed within the park is 3,225 acre Lake Arthur, a "restored" glacial lake from 10,000 years earlier Trail: After registering, you will drive about 5 miles to the walk start point. The trail is mostly wooded, with stretches of pine forest, some hills, and lake-side routing.

Some parts of the trail have exposed roots. Walking stick and hiking shoes are recommended.

Jennings Environmental Education Center: Prairies are extremely rare in Pennsylvania. They are usually found further to the west in Ohio, Indiana and across the Midwest to the Rocky Mountains. The prairie at Jennings is the only protected prairie ecosystem in Pennsylvania. It provides a habitat for plants that are unique to prairie and the endangered massasauga rattlesnake. The annual Celebrate the Bloom festival occurs when the blazing star is in peak bloom

**Trail:** The majority of the walk is on trails within the park. Some parts of the trail are rocky. Walking stick and hiking shoes are recommended.

**General Information:** The trail is not suited for strollers and wheelchair users. Pets are allowed on leashes. Please clean up after them. Although the facilities are open year-round, due to decreased park staffing and hours over the none summer hours, some might not be available. Plenty of free parking.

**Fees:** "A" award and IVV Credit is \$7.00. Moraine: The 3"x3" award patch depicts an osprey as shown to the left. Jennings: The 3x3" award patch depicts a massasauga rattlesnake as shown to the left. IVV credit only is \$3.00. You may walk for free. 

**LOCATION:** New Castle was originally settled by the Dutch West India Company in 1651, under the leadership of Peter Stuyvesant. The Dutch originally named the settlement Fort Casimir, but this was changed to Fort Trinity following its seizure by the colony of New Sweden in 1654. The Dutch conquered the entire colony of New Sweden the following year and rechristened the fort Nieuw-Amstel ("New Amstel"). As the settlement grew, Dutch authorities laid out a grid of streets and established the town common (The "Green"), which continue to this day.

In 1664, the English seized the entire New Netherland colony in the Second Anglo-Dutch War and changed the name of the town to "New Castle." The Dutch regained the town in 1673 during the Third Anglo-Dutch War but it was returned to Great Britain the next year under the Treaty of Westminster. In 1680, New Castle was conveyed to William Penn by the Duke of York and was Penn's landing place when he first set foot on American soil on October 27, 1682. The spire on top of the Court House, Delaware's Colonial capitol and first state house, was used as the center of the Twelve-Mile Circle forming the northern boundary of Delaware. Delaware formally broke from Pennsylvania in 1704.

New Castle remained the county seat until after the Civil War, when that status was transferred to Wilmington. Three signers of the Declaration of Independence were from New Castle — Thomas McKean, George Read, and George Ross.







**History:** The history of Oil Creek State Park is tied to the rise and fall of the oil industry in northwestern Pennsylvania. What is now a wild second growth forest with several cold water fishery creeks flowing through it was once the site of the vast oil industry that changed the landscape and water quality of the Oil Creek Valley.

Oil was known to exist here, but there was no practical way to extract it. In the late 1850s Seneca Oil Company (formerly the Pennsylvania Rock Oil Company) sent its manager, Colonel Edwin Drake, to start drilling on a piece of leased land just south of Titusville, near what is now Oil Creek State Park. Drake hired a salt well driller, William A. Smith, in the summer of 1859. After many difficulties, they finally drilled a commercially successful well on August 27, 1859.

The Oil Creek and Titusville Railroad, a diesel tourist excursion train, runs through the park from Oil City to Titusville, with stops throughout the park.

**Hours**: Weekdays 7:00 AM-7:00 PM. Saturday 8:00 AM-5:00 PM. Sunday 10:00 AM-3:00 PM. Closed most holidays.





The park has been designated an important Bird Area by the National Audubon Society. Bald eagles have nested in the park for several years.

**Varden Conservation Area:** It is one of ten PA State Parks without the words "State Park" in its name. It is over 400 acres of diverse habitats such as coniferous and deciduous forests, farm fields, wetlands, and ponds. After registering at Promised Land State park, you will have to drive about 25 miles to Varden. Driving directions are in the start box. There is a Comfort Inn off I-84, Exit 17 (Newfoundland/Hamlin) which is the exit for Varden Conservation Area.

**BOTH TRAILS:** Trails are on natural surfaces, through the woods on snowmobile trails and along paved highways. The trails lead through areas rich in historic and scenic interest. From mid-June until mid-July, the mountain laurel and rhododendron are in bloom.

Be aware that some trails are within hunting areas, so pay extra attention during hunting season. The trails are marked with a vertical blue blaze. At each trail intersection, a sign will designate the trail name, trail uses, distances, and directions.

**GENERAL INFORMAITON:** These trails are not suited for strollers and wheelchair users. Pets are allowed on leashes. Please clean up after them. Please use insect repellant and carry water.

**LOCATION:** The Delaware Indians originally settled in this area. The name derived from their legend about the death of an evil Indian Sorcerer, whose remains turned into searing sandflies or ponksads after his body burned to purify the area. The Indians then named the area "Ponksaduteney", or as we know it today Punxsutawney.

As the town thrived, mining the high-grade soft coal in the surrounding region supplied railroads and factories with an energy source. Factories built in the area included glassworks, foundries, ironworks, and machine shops. Farmland surrounding the town grew the organic resources for flour, feed, and silk mills.

Punxsutawney is one of the most famous small towns in America thanks to a furry little critter named Punxsutawney Phil. Celebrating traditions brought over from Europe; in 1887, the town established the Ground Hog club to celebrate Candlemas. This club's mascot has become the town's most famous resident. This charming prognosticator wakes up early from his burrow on Groundhog Day, February 2 to forecast the weather annually to his admiring fans, who wait with anticipation for his prediction at Gobbler's Knob.

The walk will start out near Phil's Burrow and depending on which distance you choose, you will make the trek up to Gobbler's Knob.

After you enjoy your walk through the weather capital of the world, take your time to visit the Weather Discovery Center at 201 North Finley Street and the Historical Society at 401 West Mahoning Street.

**TRAIL:** The 5K option will be on uneven sidewalks through town. The 10K trail will be through town with a moderate hill up to Gobbler's Knob. The 15K trail will follow parts of the Mahoning Shadow rail trail with a paved surface and crushed limestone surface. Some surfaces on the longer trails are oil & chipped roads, and crushed limestone.

It also uses a steep, natural surface, blue-blazed trail, which is an offshoot of the C&O Canal Tow Path, to climb from the river up to Ferry Hill Plantation, part of the C&O Canal Historic Park. and visits the entrance to Ferry Hill Plantation (open to visitors Memorial Day through September). There is one short section of road walking after the route visits Ferry Hill Plantation and returns to WV. Lee's Army of Northern VA crossed the Potomac River at Shepherdstown to return to (West) VA after the battle of Antietam. Federal artillery was placed on the bluff at Ferry Hill during the battle.

The walk covers parts of Shepherd College including the newly constructed Center for the creative Arts. It includes all of the historic downtown district with its collection of beautifully maintained homes and shops. A very short section of both routes in Elmwood Cemetery is on natural surface. This is truly a unique small town. There are a variety of food establishments and shops for browsing.

Shepherdstown walkers may also want to consider the 10K Out and Back Option from Lock 38 for YRE AT16/Y748, C & O Canal –Noland's Ferry to Big Slackwater, sponsored by the Maryland Volkssport Association. It is just across the Potomac River from Shepherdstown. Shepherdstown walkers actually cross the route while on the bridge over the Potomac.

It takes less than 2 hours to drive to this beautiful town from Harrisburg and the scenery on the way is worth the trip.

### START/FINISH: Clarion Hotel 233 Lowe Drive, Shepherdstown, WV

There is plenty of parking at the hotel.

HOURS: Please walk in daylight hours only.

It is suitable for strollers and wheelchairs and goes through State College neighborhoods and the commercial area of the town. If you are walking this trail, please note that many campus sites are closed on major holidays and breaks.



**LOCATION:** Thurmont is located at the base of the beautiful Catoctin Mountains in Frederick MD. Easily accessible via US Route 15 and is a pleasant scenic drive from points north and south. It is only 50 miles from Baltimore, Washington DC and Harrisburg PA. On the second weekend of October, Thurmont hosts one of the largest juried arts and crafts shows on the East Coast with about 300 artists.

**TOWN TRAIL:** It is on sidewalks and road shoulders around business and residential streets. New trail this year. Strollers and wheelchairs would have some difficulty.

Catoctin Trail: After registering, you must drive about 3 miles to the Park Office for Catoctin Mountain Park (National Park Service). The trail is through the woods in the park. There is no fee for this park. It visits Cunningham Falls which has a 78 ft drop and is the highest waterfall in Maryland. It also visits overlooks at Hog Rock and Thurmont Vista. Strollers and wheelchairs would not be able to maneuver this trail.

Catoctin's diverse cultural resources provide several vignettes of our nation's history in one small location. Native Americans quarried rhyolite for the production of lithic tools. A charcoal and iron industry is still visible today, along with smaller industries including farms, sawmills, and an old moonshine still. 





About Valley Forge Park: Valley Forge is perhaps the best known place name associated with the American Revolution. To truly enjoy the park, it is important that you understand the significance of the events associated with the winter encampment of 1777-78. The National Park Service provides various programs, tours, and other interpretive activities to help you grasp more fully the dramatic story Valley Forge has to tell. Park Rangers make every effort to accommodate all visitors in these presentations. It is the goal of the National Park Service to make the park accessible to all visitors.

The recommended first stop is the park's Welcome Center. A 15 minute film shown every 30 minutes in the auditorium provides an introduction to life during the encampment. The George C. Neumann Collection, an extensive collection of firearms, swords, and accessories, is the focal point of the exhibit area. Information on restaurants, attractions, and overnight accommodations in the greater Valley Forge area is available at the PA Travel Desk in the Welcome Center. The building also contains a bookstore with a wide range of publications. Restrooms are available. Water should be carried.

Sponsors: The Liberty Bell Wanderers, the Valley Forge National Historical Park, and the Valley Forge Park Interpretive Association.

Trails: The Historic Walk is mostly on blacktop multi-

trails in rolling countryside in the most historical section of the park. It passes most major memorials, log huts and Washington's Headquarters. The trail is suited for wheeled conveyances. Since the trail is a multi-use trail, please watch out for joggers and bicyclists. Strollers would be ok, but wheelchairs would have some difficulty.

The Creek Walk starts at Washington's Headquarters then follows a gravel path along Valley Creek to a covered bridge built in 1865. Walk along a wooded trail leading to the Washington Memorial Chapel, and partially along a paved multiuse trail. 



**LOCATION:** The main feature of this walk is the Haines Shoe House. Built in 1948, this was "Colonel" Mahion N. Haines' most outlandish advertising gimmick. Known as the "Shoe Wizard of York", Haines was one of York County's most colorful and illustrious citizens. Haines built a shoe sales empire in central Pennsylvania and northern Maryland that at its height included more than 40 stores.

The Shoe House is a boot shaped wood frame structure covered with wire lath and coated with a cement stucco. It measures 48 foot long, 17 foot wide and 25 foot high. The interior consists of five different levels and contains three bedrooms, two baths, a kitchen and living room.

In the first year, elderly couples were invited to stay for a weekend and live like "kings and queens" at Haines' expense. They had a maid, cook, chauffeur and automobile at their disposal and the couple was outfitted from head to toe in new clothing donated by local stores.

In 1850 honeymooning couples from any town with a Haines shoe store were invited to stay at the Shoe House.

Shoe House Hours: Summer - June, July and August - Wednesday through Sunday 11 am to 4 pm. Fall - September and October - Saturday and Sunday 11 am to 4 pm. Winter and Spring - November through May - hours are by appointment. Discounted cost for Volksmarchers for the tour of the house is \$4; tour of the house and dish of ice cream is \$5.50. (717-840-8339)


