Upcoming Events—Please Join Us!

- Opt-Out Walk—Group Walk in Lancaster, Saturday, November 30, 9:00 AM
 - ⇒ Meet in the 200 block of N. Reservoir St. (between E. Chestnut St. and E. Walnut St.) in the area of the Giant, Direct/Peapod, and Rite Aid stores.
 - ⇒ Parking: parking in the business lots is *not* recommended due to signs in these lots indicating cars may be towed. We have two options: street parking, or use the public parking on East Orange St., 800 block, between Broad St. and Reservoir St.
 - ⇒ Note that this is not the normal start point of the Lancaster walk. The normal start point is the Bridgeport Weis store, and walkers drive to a location on Reservoir Street after signing-in to begin the walk. For this group walk, we will eliminate this extra step and just start the walk at a convenient spot along the trail. A reminder email will be sent prior to the event, confirming details.

 - ⇒ Mark the date and look for details coming up.
 - ⇒ We may plan again a Friday evening group pre-walk to enjoy the amazing view of the ice sculptures under spotlights.
- Susquehanna Rivertowns Weekend April 24-26
 - ⇒ Again the Pacers will join the York White Rose Wanderers and the Susquehanna Rovers for this three-day event.



- New Lititz-to-Ephrata Rail Trail Bike YRE opening February 1, 2020
 - ⇒ Event starts at Lititz end, same start point as the Lititz walk YRE.
