
Group Walks Report

The Peak Pass Preview Event—October 24th

We received an email from Steve & Carol Schell, long-time members of the Penn Dutch Pacers (Carol is the sister of Russ Bechtold, whom PDP "old timers" will remember well), sharing about an event that may interest Pacers: "South Mountain YMCA is opening their 600 acres in Berks County for walking. To introduce walkers to the property there will be **a series of hikes** on **Sunday, October 24th**. See detail information below. We feel that this would be a great opportunity for club members, especially those living close to Berks County."

This fall the South Mountain YMCA Camps announced the **Peak Pass Program**. This program gives the participant access to our miles of trails on and around Cushion Peak (after an application and background check are completed). Peak Pass holders will be given ID badges and parking permits for their participation. Trails can be used for hiking, biking, cross country skiing, or snowshoeing.

On October 24th, we'll be opening our trails as a "preview." Guided hikes may include the Perimeter Trail, the Spring House Trail, and the Lower Loop Trail. The trail to Cushion



Peak will be self-guided. **There is no fee for the Peak Pass Preview event**, but there is an annual fee of \$50 to purchase a Peak Pass for future use. Call Camp at 610-670-2267 or email <u>ycamps@smymca.org</u> for more information.

New Special Programs to begin in 2022

Rails-to-Trails

- Program runs January 1, 2022 December 31, 2025.
- Redeem completed books by December 31, 2026.
- Any sanctioned YRE, seasonal, or traditional event that walks/bikes on a portion of an official Rails-to-Trails Conservancy-identified trail qualifies.
- Qualified trails can be found at <u>www.traillink.com/trailsearch</u>.
- One stamp per event per year except for "Guided Trail" events which use the same stamp; in this case the sanction number identifies a unique event.
- Special Program Booklet contains room for 16 stamps. To purchase the Booklet, send check for \$12 to Colorado Springs Walking Club, 3524 N. Cascade Ave, Lot #58, Colorado Springs, CO 80907.
- Mail your completed book to Sherry Sayers, 3524 N. Cascade Ave., #58, Colorado Springs, CO 80907, or scan image of completed book and email it to <u>cswc@avaclubs.org</u>. A 3"x4" award patch will be mailed to you. POC: Sherry Sayers, 719-640-6745, <u>cswc@avaclubs.org</u>.

Town Halls/City Halls

- The program runs January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2024.
- Redeem completed books by December 31, 2025.
- Complete 15 AVA-sanctioned walks that include a town/city hall building (which must be marked as such or have a plaque as a historic site). A hall may only be used once, even if multiple walks go by it.
- The patch depicts the Ashland Town Hall and the Fredericksburg City Hall, both in Virginia.
- Cost of the program is \$10. Order books from Peninsula Pathfinders, 302 Queens Crescent, Williamsburg, VA 23185. Make checks payable to Peninsula Pathfinders.
